Vignan Institute of Law organized Special Lecture on 'New Criminal Laws'

The Vignan Institute of Law organized a Special Lecture on 'New Criminal Laws' on 6th April 2024. The resource person of the event was K. Sivaleela, Assistant Public Prosecutor at the Excise Court in Guntur. She discussed the significant changes brought about by the new criminal laws, namely Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, and Bharatiya Sakshya Adhiniyam, which are set to be implemented from 1st July 2024.

Sivaleela highlighted that the new laws have introduced certain modifications when compared to the previous laws. For instance, as per Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, for the first time Community Service has been included as a punishment for petty offenses. Additionally, the new law addresses issues such as punishment for mob lynching.

The other guest Ms. Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, explained about how the law aims to address delays in investigation and trial by providing timelines for completing certain proceedings. It also introduces new provisions like the registration of First Information Reports (FIR), rights of victims, and witness protection. She also pointed out that electronic evidence has been given importance by making it primary evidence. This highlights the significance of technological advancements in the criminal justice system.

Throughout the lecture, Sivaleela compared the provisions of the new laws with the old ones, such as the Indian Penal Code, Code of Criminal Procedure, and Indian Evidence Act. She concluded by stating that, although there are some modifications, the core legal principles related to criminal law remain applicable under the new legislations.

Faculty members and students from Vignan Institute of Law actively participated in the event, gaining valuable insights into the upcoming changes in the Indian criminal justice system.

Guest Lecture Organized by Department of Biotechnology



A guest lecture titled "IPRs are Key for Academic and Industry Excellence" was delivered by Dr. H. Purushotham, DPIIT-IPR Chair Professor at the Centre for Intellectual Property Rights, Andhra University, Visakhapatnam. The online lecture took place on April 8, 2024, from 11:30 AM to 1:00 PM, catering to an audience of 60 students (II B.Tech. Bioinformatics & II B.Tech. Biotechnology) and faculty members of VFSTR. The event was organized by Dr. Sankaran Krishnamoorthy (Dept. of Biotechnology), Dr. Chandrasekhar Kuppam (Dept. of Biotechnology), and Dr. B. Nageswara Rao (Director E-Cell) of VFSTR.

Dr. Purushotham, with 40 years of experience in R&D, IP, Innovation, Industry, and Teaching, provided the audience with a comprehensive understanding of Intellectual Property Rights (IPRs). He covered the fundamentals of IPRs, their significance in both academic and industrial settings, and the various categories that exist. The lecture focused on the two main categories of IPRs: Industrial Property (patents, trademarks, industrial designs, etc.) and Copyright & Related Rights.

Dr. Purushotham delved into patents, trademarks, trade secrets, geographical indications, plant varieties, and farmers' rights within the Industrial Property category. He emphasized the importance of patents, which grant ownership rights for inventions, and discussed the contrasting scenarios with and without patent protection under Indian IP laws. Weak IP protection can lead to larger companies dominating smaller ones, as highlighted by the professor.

A real-world example showcasing the impact of IP on the US economy was presented, reinforcing the concept of IPRs as "intellectual currency." The lecture also addressed the critical stages of IPRs: creation, protection, and commercialization. Dr. Purushotham explained the three key criteria for patentability: novelty, non-obviousness, and industrial applicability. He outlined the process of filing patents in India and the factors influencing the success or failure of intellectual properties.

The lecture concluded by emphasizing the role of IP in fostering innovation and driving industrial growth. By providing an in-depth understanding of IPRs, their categories, and their importance, Dr. Purushotham's lecture aimed to equip the audience with the knowledge to navigate the complex world of intellectual property rights in academia and industry.

This interaction aimed to strengthen the collaboration between the academic institution and the industry, ensuring that students receive valuable practical exposure and that the company benefits from the expertise of the university's faculty and research scholars.
