Workshop on Commodity Derivatives Conducted @ VFSTR



The Department of Finance, VFSTR, successfully conducted a three-day workshop titled “Mastering Commodity Derivatives: Tools for Hedging and Speculation” from August 6th to 8th, 2024. The workshop aimed to enhance the understanding and expertise of faculty members, researchers, and students in commodity markets, derivatives trading, risk management, and regulatory frameworks.

The workshop commenced with opening remarks from the Convenor, Dr. Durga, who emphasized the importance of effective risk management in investment. She referenced Warren Buffett’s famous advice: “Rule No. 1: Never lose money. Rule No. 2: Don’t forget Rule No. 1,” underscoring the critical role of derivatives in mitigating risk. The workshop highlighted the vast scope of derivatives, encompassing both financial and commodity derivatives, and the need for a solid understanding of this dynamic field.

MCX India Ltd., Mumbai, played a significant role in promoting and educating participants about commodity derivatives. Mr. Ashutosh, Assistant Vice President of MCX India Ltd., served as the resource person for the workshop. He brought extensive knowledge

of commodity derivatives and provided valuable insights into the subject.

Although initially planned as a regional workshop, the event attracted national attention, with participants registering from Telangana, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Delhi, and Uttar Pradesh. A total of 170 registrations were recorded, with around 100 participants attending offline and the remainder joining online via Google Meet.



The Head of the Department highlighted the importance of investment and derivatives, praising the convenor for organizing the workshop. The Dean also encouraged students to actively participate and congratulated the convenor, resource person, and the entire team for the successful conduction of the workshop.

The resource person, Mr. Ashutosh, expressed his gratitude to the dignitaries for the invitation and emphasized the significance of derivatives in the financial world.

Regular presentations and invited talks by experts in the field can further enrich the research environment. These events will expose participants to the latest developments and methodologies, enhancing their research capabilities. As suggested by the NEP, integrating research ideas into curriculum design is vital, ensuring that our academic programs are closely aligned with the department's project goals and the broader objectives of the institution.

To kickstart this initiative, the department could organize a comprehensive three-day seminar or workshop, featuring prominent researchers and industry experts. The event would serve as a cornerstone for the research forum, providing valuable insights and setting the tone for future research endeavors. The seminar could include sessions on current research trends, collaborative research strategies, and opportunities for securing funding. By initiating such research projects, the department
