Workshop on Mastering DevOps Tools: From GIT to Docker

On March 28, 2024.A national-level workshop was held in the department of IT, the programme was inaugurated by Dr. N. Veeranjaneyulu, Professor and Head, IT&CA, The resource persons of the event was Mr. Hashir Akram, a corporate trainer from Hummingbirds Systems, and Mr. Ahsan Alimaad, a trainer at Hummingbirds Systems.

Topics covered included building a DevOps culture, designing automated pipelines, and optimizing feedback loops for continuous improvement. Sharing practical insights from experienced DevOps practitioners, the attendees received valuable guidance on overcoming challenges and driving successful DevOps initiatives.
