



## Faculty Orientation Program 2023



**DAY 1:** The faculty orientation program is organized by the Academy for Faculty Development (AFD) team as per the directions of the Vice Chancellor and guidance of the Dean, Faculty Affairs, on February 25, 2023, at 2 p.m. at Vignan NTR Library, 1st floor, Video Conference Hall. The inaugural function was graced by Hon'ble Vice Chancellor Prof. P. Nagabhusan, Dean, Faculty Affairs Dr. Vijaya Ramu, and Dr. Ramesh Babu T., Director, AHS. The FOP-2023's newly joined faculty members from different departments attended the session. Dr. Vijaya Ramu, Dean, Faculty Affairs, began opening remarks by welcoming all the dignitaries and FOP participants.

He invited all 42 faculty members to introduce themselves one by one, and then he explained the importance and objectives of this orientation program. Dr. Ramesh Babu T, Director of AHS, also congratulated and welcomed all the participants and said that this type of orientation program develops the competencies and teaching skills of the individuals. Soon after his talk, the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor started his presentation on "Nurturing Excellence through NEP 2020." During his talk, he explained the types of assessments and their importance. He has given a clear picture of formative T1, T2, T3, T4, and T5 assessments, as well as summative assessments. Further to this, he also suggested how to set questions by following Bloom's taxonomy from lower order to higher order thinking levels. Finally, the first day of the FOP ended with refreshments.

**DAY 2:** though it was Sunday, all 42 faculty members attended the FOP program at 10 a.m. The morning session started with a presentation on the "Vision and Mission of VFSTR/Common Minimum Professional Attributes Expected of a Faculty in HE" by Dr. Vijaya Ramu, Dean, Faculty Affairs. He said how the vision of VFSTR is framed and how it is linked with the missions of all departments. He also discussed the professional qualities that faculty members are expected to possess. He also shared information on VFSTR's 7th Pay, how it is framed, and what the criteria are for assistants, associates, and professors. During his interaction, he answered all the queries raised by participants.

After the tea break, the second session started with a talk on "Principles of OBE, CLA-CO, and PO mapping and setting question papers, etc." by Dr. M. Sarada, Joint Dean, AAA. She clearly explained what outcome-based education is and how to

write course outcomes for each subject. She also explained ways and means to set the program outcomes by keeping Bloom's Taxonomy in mind with the help of program-specific objectives. She also discussed how to map the question paper with POs and COs following the Blooms taxonomy. The presentation was more informative, and she cleared all the queries raised by the participants with extraordinary energy.

After lunch, the post-lunch session started at 2 p.m. The AFD team handled the session, had interactions with the faculty members, collected the topics for microteaching, and also released a batch-wise schedule for microteaching presentations. Finally, the session ended at 4 p.m.

**DAY 3:** The day started with a presentation by the Dean, Student Affairs, Dr. M.S.S. Ruknini, and the University Counseling Psychologist, Ms. Shabana Azmi, on "Counseling Techniques for Addressing Students' Issues." They explained the duties and responsibilities of the dean, student affairs, and the psychologist. Ms. Shabana Azmi explained the techniques and how to do counseling in general, including sensitive and critical issues, and also how to address them in a number of sittings. They gave a very good response to the queries raised by the faculty members.

After the tea break, microteaching sessions started, which were conducted by the AFD team with the help of department subject experts as mentors to evaluate microteaching presentations. The first presentation started with the School of Applied Sciences and Humanities. A total of 10 faculty members from the department of English, Statistics, and Mathematics presented their microteaching lessons.

**DAY 4:** The Dean, AAA team's Joint AAA, Dr. N. S. Sampath Kumar, started day 4 session on the topic "An overview of R-22, its structure of assessment from T1 to T5, and how the overall grading system works." At first, he explained clearly the differences in assessing students before and after R-22. He also explained about the formative and summative assessments and what the minimum score to pass was. Further to this, he briefed about the grading system followed and what is meant by repetition (R) and incomplete (I). He deliberated about the types of semester and end exams.

Soon after the tea break, the microteaching session started for CSE and ECE faculty members. Two ECE faculty members presented first, followed by eight CSE faculty members, whose lessons were observed and evaluated by senior faculty members of ECE and CSE.



**DAY 5:** Dr. Syed Irshaan, Head of Chemical Engineering, presented a talk on "R-22: A Learning Quotient from a Student and Faculty Perspective." He energetically interacted with the faculty about formative assessment from T1 to T5. The doubts that arose among students at each formative level and how to solve the situation were thoroughly discussed.

The micro teaching presentations started for 4 biotech faculty, 1 mechanical faculty, and 6 pharmacy faculty. Their lessons were observed by senior faculty members from their respective departments.

**DAY 6 and 7 :** fully engaged with microteaching presentations The faculty from Applied Engineering, EEE, AHS, and Mathematics presented their microteaching lessons, which are mentored and observed by senior faculty from their respective departments. Finally, all 42 participants completed their turns of microteaching lessons before the beginning of the valedictory function.

**DAY 8: Valedictory**

On March 6, 2023, the AFD Team Chief Coordinator, Mr. Nagendra Howji, and Dr. Vijaya Kumar Chavan organized a valedictory session at 10 a.m. in the NTR Vignan Library's Video Conference Hall. The Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, Prof. P. Nagabhusan, and Dean, Faculty Affairs, Dr. Vijay Ramu, graced the occasion along with 42 participants. Firstly, the Dean, Faculty Affairs invited one faculty member from each department to share their reflections. The faculty attending FOP-2023 gave constructive feedback on FOP, like knowing about R-22, the vision and mission of VFSTR, counseling, etc. Finally, the Vice Chancellor delivered closing remarks and once again reminded and reiterated the faculty about formative and summative assessments. The certificate distribution was done by the Vice Chancellor and Dean, Faculty Affairs. Before having high tea, a group photo session was held. The Vice Chancellor and Dr. Vijaya Ramu congratulated the AFD Team for organizing FOP-2023 in an excellent manner.
