



Awareness on online Scams



Creating awareness about the online scam by the students at Selapadu village on September 12, 2023, from 2.00 PM to 4.00 PM. The program was organized by the UEAC Team under the supervision of Dr. Vijayababu Palukuri, UEAC Program Officer, and UEAC coordinator Mr. Suresh Babu. The UEAC team members were segregated into four different teams, each consisting of six members. All the team members came forward with the motive to bring awareness to the people regarding the fraudulent websites, calls, and social engineering tactics and suggested tips to not get trapped in these scams and have a safe internet journey.

The teams shared informative posts and videos on how to identify and avoid online scams, such as strong password practices, two-factor authentication, verifying the authenticity of websites, etc. They educated them about how and where to report suspected scams.

Dr. Vijayababu addressed the fact that around 63.5 percent of the world's population uses the Internet today, and studies show that per second, 8 new users are added to it. The Internet can be very advantageous, but only if used right. Considering the amount of people dependent on it today, it is obvious that the Internet is not a safe space if not used or accessed rightly, as it makes it easy for scammers to trick people into giving away their money and personal information. Therefore, it is necessary to inform people about the online scams happening so that they can be cautious before something unfortunate happens.

The British Deputy High Commissioner visited Vignans University

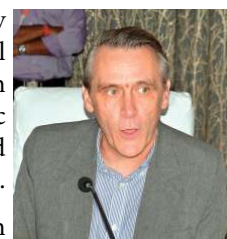

The chief guest of the program was the British Deputy High Commissioner of Andhra Pradesh and Telangana states, Mr. Gareth Win Owen, who visited VFSTR. The vice chancellor, Dr. P. Dr. Lavu Rathaiah opined that with such collaboration, students and faculty can gain a global perspective by engaging in international collaborations, fostering a broader understanding of diverse cultures and viewpoints. He also opined that by organizing programs jointly, the partnership between the two can be strengthened and educational skills can be developed.

An orientation session for international students was held at VFSTR from 1:30 to 2:30 on Friday i.e on September 8, 2023. Mrs. Shabana Azmi, a psychologist, addressed them about strategies for coping with the stress of adapting to a new academic environment. She highlighted how to deal with cultural adjustment, homesickness, building resilience, self-care, time management, and academic stress effectively and how to create a support network among fellow friends and staff members.

Encouraged students to seek help when needed, reducing the stigma around some health issues. She highlighted the techniques for developing resilience and emotional well-being in the face of challenges.

Her presentation aims to raise awareness about providing students with practical strategies to navigate the emotional aspects.
