World's Largest Cervical Cancer Awareness Program to be held @ VFSTR

The World's Largest Cervical Cancer Awareness Program will be organized on March 18, 2023, at VFSTR under the joint auspices of the Grace Cancer Foundation and CPIO (Collective Power of One International, USA). A program was organized for the poster release, and Dr. Lavu Rattaiah, Chairman, Vignan's Educational Institutions, unveiled the poster of the awareness program. On this occasion, University Vice Chancellor Prof. P. Nagabhushan said that Dr. Chinnababu Sunkavalli, Director Robotic Surgical Oncologist, Yashoda Hospital, Hyderabad, Dr. Satya S. Kalangi, Founder, CEO, USA-Texas, CPIO, USA-Texas, and CPIO Board

Specialist Member, Dr. Venkata Sujatha Velankilu, informed that they would be present.

He also stated that, a woman dies of cervical cancer every two minutes in the world, and one woman dies every eight minutes in our country. Cervical cancer is one of the main causes of death for women in nearly 40 countries. It was informed that Vignan University has undertaken to educate more than 5,000 women on how to detect cervical cancer at the right time. It is said that this is the first time that so many people have been made aware of this issue at the same time.

international quality and skill on this occasion. there are more than 15 thousand students from the states across the country have already registered to participate in Vignan Srijanankura 2K23. He said that cash prizes worth Rs. 9 lakh would be given to the winners of the Vignan Srijanankura-2k23 competition.

He said that VFSTR is going to organize competitions in all nine categories in the national level creative contest. Automation, Infra Engineering, Food Processing, Chemical Technology, Computer Applications, Pharma and Life Senses, Electronics, Management Studies, and Basic Science competitions will be held. These include project expos, technical poster presentations, hackathons, and ideation sessions.

Also, these events would be held at a considerable expense in order to foster student creativity and research capacity. 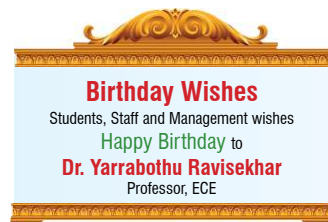
