## Faculty Development Programme on Impactful Presentation Skills

The Department of English, Indian, and Other Foreign Languages (EOFL), in collaboration with School of Applied Sciences and Humanities has organized a three-day Faculty Development Programme (FDP) on “Impactful Presentation Skills” from March 14 to March 16, 2024. The resource person for the event was Dr. Mira Vempati, CEO of Mira Soft-skills Solutions, who provided insightful sessions on enhancing presentation effectiveness.



### Day 1: Introduction & Extempore Exercise

Dr. Mira Vempati commenced the session with an engaging introduction to the fundamentals of impactful presentations. She emphasized the importance of clarity, confidence, and audience engagement. To put these principles into practice, she assigned an extempore speaking task to the faculty members. The enthusiastic participation showcased their ability to think on their feet and deliver spontaneous speeches effectively.

The chief guest, Dr. Lavu Rathaiah, Chairman of VFSTR, addressed the gathering, emphasizing that language serves as both a medium of expression and an art form. He marked the significance of honing linguistic and presentation skills, urging educators to actively engage in such Faculty Development Programmes. He further highlighted the necessity for faculty members to integrate corporate communication strategies into



their teaching methodologies, ensuring a more impactful and professional approach to knowledge dissemination.

### Day 2: Communication Strategies & Personality Influence

On the second day, the session focused on the verbal and non-verbal aspects of communication, highlighting the 7 C's of communication—clarity, conciseness, concreteness, correctness, coherence, completeness, and courtesy.

Additionally, Dr. Vempati delved into the profound influence of personality on behavioral communication, illustrating how

an individual's disposition shapes their interaction with others. She highlighted the power of attire in projecting confidence and credibility, advocating the principle of “dressing one level higher” to leave a lasting impression. The session also explored problem-solving methodologies and the essence of leadership-driven motivation, equipping participants with strategies to

navigate challenges effectively. Emphasizing the art of assertive communication, she encouraged faculty members to adopt the mindset of a “teller” rather than an “asker”, fostering clarity and conviction in their speech. Furthermore, she introduced the Amiable Communication Style, underscoring the significance of persuasive storytelling and compelling discourse in captivating an audience and enhancing engagement.

### Day 3: Recap & Editing Activity

The final day began with a recap of key takeaways from the previous sessions, followed by an interactive editing activity to refine presentation content. Faculty members were encouraged to focus on clarity, structure, and impactful delivery.



**Valedictory Session**

In the post-lunch session on March 16, 2024, Vice-Chancellor, Professor Colonel P. Naagabhushan, addressed the gathering. In his valedictory speech, he emphasized that presentation skills are not just learned but are intrinsic abilities that can be nurtured and refined. He encouraged faculty members to continuously develop their skills to become more effective educators and communicators.

The three-day FDP proved to be an enriching experience, equipping faculty with essential strategies to deliver compelling and engaging presentations.
