Faculty Immersion Programme (FIIP) - Phase II

The Faculty Immersion Programme – Phase II was conducted on 21st July 2025 at the Board Room. The primary agenda of the meeting was to provide insights into the objectives and expectations of the upcoming FIIP initiative.

The Chairman, Dr.Lavu Rathaiah, addressed the faculty team, emphasizing the true spirit of the programme. He stated that faculty members deputed to various industries and institutions must not only acquire new knowledge but also remain grounded and open-minded. He clearly articulated that learning should be coupled with humility, and faculty members must avoid any display of superiority or attitude.

He proudly highlighted that VFSTR is the first institute in India to introduce such a pioneering initiative. Interestingly, the same model is now being proposed by AICTE, which shows that VFSTR is ahead of even the government's educational strategies.

Further, he elaborated on the do's and don'ts to be followed during the immersion. He encouraged faculty to:

- Understand the organization's structure and operations.
- Focus on the broader goal of social development.
- Identify the expected outcomes that can enhance academic practices.
- Think beyond textbooks and theoretical frameworks.
- Apply real-time industry experiences upon return.
- Innovate and update the curriculum based on their immersion learnings.

He also stressed that faculty should consider how they can contribute to the industry, not just the university. They are expected to:

- Establish meaningful collaborations with industry professionals.
- Motivate and prepare industry personnel for Ph.D. admissions.

- Promote and support research initiatives through the university's Centre of Excellence.
- Assist in adding academic value to the industry's products and processes.

Dr. Malakondaiah, former Director General of Police (DGP), addressed the gathering with a thought-provoking message. He emphasized the importance of continual learning and encouraged faculty members to explore new knowledge and insights. He highlighted the critical need to understand the existing gaps between academia and industry and work towards bridging them effectively.

He noted that the National Education Policy (NEP) strongly advocates for establishing and maintaining robust connections with industry. Such collaborations, he stated, help broaden one's perspective, transform traditional ways of thinking, and foster innovation in both teaching and research. Reflecting on history, he remarked that as early as 1945, institutions like the IITs had begun cultivating strong industry partnerships. He appreciated VFSTR for taking a similar pioneering step through the Faculty Immersion Programme, describing it as a significant beginning that aligns with India's progressive academic vision.

Prof. P. Nagabhushan, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor, addressed the faculty members with great enthusiasm and appreciation. He began by congratulating the faculty for participating in the Faculty Immersion Programme and acknowledged their commitment to professional and academic growth.

He emphasized the importance of collaborations with prestigious institutions such as ISRO, DRDO, and international partners, stating that such associations enhance the overall qualifications and capabilities of the industry and academia alike. He urged faculty members to treat the immersion experience as a life-enriching journey one that brings about a meaningful transformation in their approach to teaching and research. He encouraged them to apply fresh perspectives in academics and adopt innovative methods in curriculum delivery.

He also advised faculty to clearly explain institutional regulations during interactions, especially the LTP (Lecture-Tutorial-Practical) structure. He called for a shift away from monologic, lecture-heavy teaching and recommended increasing interactive, dialogue-based sessions.

He finally, concluded by inspiring the faculty to invest time in thinking creatively and exploring new, effective ways to engage students, aligning education with real-world relevance and innovation.

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Innovation – Entrepreneurship FDP Commenced at VFSTR



A five-day Faculty Development Programme (FDP) on 'Innovation – Entrepreneurship' was inaugurated on Monday I.e 21st July, 2025, at VFSTR. Organised by Vignan TBI, with financial support from AICTE and the Ministry of Education's Innovation Cell. The program saw enthusiastic participation from over 60 faculty members representing various higher educational institutions across Andhra Pradesh and Telangana, spanning diverse academic disciplines.



The inaugural session was graced by distinguished speakers who emphasized the importance of interdisciplinary approaches in academia. Dr. B.S. Ramakrishna, CEO of Aspire TBI, served as the chief guest and delivered an insightful session on 'Creativity and Idea Generation'. He emphasized that creativity is not an innate talent but a learnable skill, urging educators to overcome mental blocks and practice creative thinking through consistent effort and structured techniques.

Adding further depth to the program, Dr. Ravi Chandra Raju, Ashoka, Fellow and Innovation Coach, focused on 'Developing Business Ideas in Students'. He encouraged faculty to shift from conventional problem-solving methods to more student-centric, exploratory approaches that nurture curiosity, innovation, and risk-taking among students. He reminded educators of their critical role in helping students identify real-world challenges and convert them into viable entrepreneurial opportunities.

Col, Dr. P. Nagabhushan, Vice Chancellor, shared his deep reflections on why entrepreneurship is essential, not just for students, but equally for faculty. He began by gently challenging the traditional notion of entrepreneurship.



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"Entrepreneurship is not just about launching a business," he said. "It's about how you think, how you approach a problem, how you respond to uncertainty and most importantly, how you create value where there was none."

He also emphasized that for faculty, embracing an entrepreneurial mindset is no longer optional it's necessary. He inspired both faculty and students to rethink their roles: "We are not here to simply deliver lectures and complete syllabus. We are here to ignite minds, to raise questions, to nurture problem solvers." He believes that when faculty adopt entrepreneurial thinking, they begin to create learning environments that are dynamic, purpose driven, and relevant to the times.

These sessions were thoughtfully designed to equip faculty with the necessary tools, skills, and innovative mindsets to transform their academic environments. By fostering a culture of creativity and critical thinking, the program ultimately aims to empower students with the vision, confidence, and capability to become proactive changemakers in society.
