India and Israel Strengthen Agricultural Collaboration: A Focus on Technology, Education, and Research



India and Israel are solidifying their relationship, particularly in the agricultural sector. Recently, representatives from Israel, Mr. Navar Gilon, the Ambassador, visited Vignan's University. In this regard a special event was held in the School of Agriculture and Horticulture Sciences.

During the event, Ambassador Navar Gilon highlighted the importance of exploring collaboration opportunities in agricultural technology, education, research, and cultural exchange between India and Israel. The emphasis was on strengthening ties and fostering mutual cooperation.

Following the event, a special meeting took place with Dr. Lavu Rathaiah, Chairman, and Professor P. Nagabhushan, Vice-Chancellor. The discussions covered a range of topics, including agricultural technology, education, research, and various academic aspects, with a focus on enhancing bilateral relations.

Ideas were exchanged to reinforce collaborations between the two nations.

Apart from academic discussions, the event aimed at promoting bilateral relations and mutual cooperation. The collaboration aims to leverage the expertise of both nations for the benefit of students,



faculty, and the broader academic community. Deliberations included the exploration of joint master's and Ph.D. programs, as well as the establishment of centers of excellence to encourage research and entrepreneurship.



A Three-Day Workshop: Empowering Through Prevention: Professional Training on Life-Saving Education



From 5-7, January 2024, the Department of Social Sciences and Humanities, VFSTR hosted a three-day workshop in collaboration with AFD-VFSTR, IQAC-VFSTR, and APAI (Associated Psychological Association of India). The workshop focused on the theme of 'Empowering through Prevention." The event featured eminent resource persons and chief speakers, including Mr. Visesh – Psychologist and President IANLP Hyderabad; Dr. Srikanth Goggi - Clinical Psychologist and Founder of GVA Institute of

Psychology; Ms. Ramya Agasthi - Psychologist/Journalist and Founder of The Wings of Mind, Vizag; Dr. N. Umajyothi – M.D. Psychiatry, Professor & HoD, Department of Psychiatry, Guntur Medical College; Ms. Laxmi Rao H.T. – Director, Bezawada Institute for Learning Development; Dr. T. D. Vimala, Honorary Professor, Department of Psychology, Acharya Nagarjuna University; Dr. Ayodhya R. K. - founder and Director Sree Manasa Psychiatric Nursing Home Vijayawada; Dr. P. Swathi – Professor and Chairperson BoS, Director, UGC – HRDC, Osmania University; and Mr. Gangadhar Bareddy, Pediatric Psychologist, Hyderabad. The speakers shared valuable insights on empowering youth by preventing suicidal behaviors.

The workshop started with inauguration by the Honorable Vice-Chancellor Dr. P. Nagabhushan, accompanied by Dr. N. Srinivas, School Dean, Applied Sciences and Humanities; APAI President Mr. Rajeswarao; Dr. A. Sharada, Director, AFD; Dr. M. S. S. Rukmini, Dean Student Affairs; and Dr. D. Adam Stephen, HoD Social Sciences and Humanities. Mr. Visesh spoke on the importance of hope in life and how individuals can cultivate it happily. Dr.



Srikanth addressed how different thoughts reflect on behavior and explained various spectrums of mental disorders related to suicidal risk, using case examples and real-life experiences.

On the second day, Dr. N. Umajyothi discussed clinical methodologies for assessing risk levels and treating individuals with suicidal behavior. In the afternoon, Ms. Ramya Agasthi and Ms. Laxmi engaged participants in icebreaker activities to energize them and emphasized the role of human connections in enhancing productivity through teamwork. Prof. Vimala highlighted the importance of a positive mindset in restraining impulsive behaviors, introducing a Positivity Rating Scale for participants to develop positive thinking techniques.

The third day began with Dr. Ayodhya sharing statistics on the dangerous yet preventable nature of suicide, using case studies to illustrate professional interventions. Dr. Swathi introduced mental health first aid and safety plans, emphasizing their role as go-to interventions for suicide risk. Mr. Gangadhar Bareddy,

a pediatric psychologist, discussed suicide prevention through crisis intervention and psychometric instruments, providing insights on language and body cues of individuals at risk. The workshop concluded with felicitation and certificate distribution in the presence of Honorable Chairman Dr. Lavu Rathaiah, Honorable Vice-Chancellor Dr. P. Nagabhushan, and other internal dignitaries.
