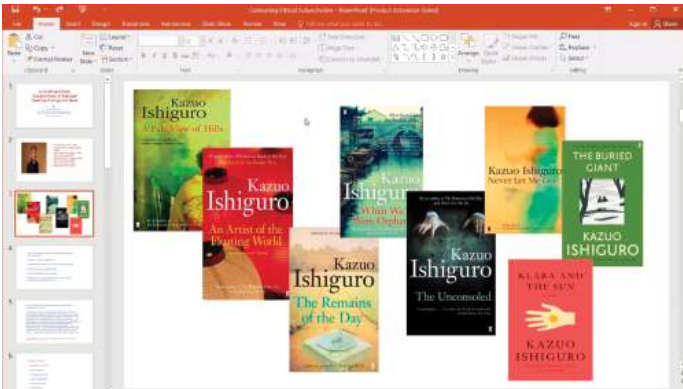




Sodhana Sanglap 2024: A Colloquium on Language and Literature



“Sodhana Sanglap 2024: A Colloquium on Language and Literature” was held on May 18, 2024. The topic of the colloquium was “Cultivating Ethical Subjectivities: A Nuanced Reading of Ishiguro’s Texts.” The lecture was delivered by Professor A. Sharadha Allamneni, Dean of International Student Affairs.

The lecture aimed to explore the ways in which Ishiguro’s texts, such as “The Remains of the Day” and “Never Let Me Go,” reflect on the complexities of human relationships, memory, and morality. By examining the themes and characters in these texts, Professor Allamneni sought to shed light on the ways in which literature can help us understand the importance of cultivating



ethical subjectivities and how this can be achieved through a nuanced reading of literary texts.
