2. The coaching for such competitive exams has to be planned comprehensively and meticulously. Keeping in the mind the demands of civil service exam and cut throat competition, a 500-hour coaching plan is contemplated to train the students of VFSTR.
3. VCSA has brought structural changes in the course from this batch. Instead of floating the course from 2nd year, we have stated the course from 1st year 2nd sem. The reason behind these changes is:
 - a. Course can be completed by the time students reach 3rd year 2nd Sem. This gives them ample time to prepare for the competitive exams and appear for the exam as soon as they complete B.Tech.
 - b. In 4th year students can also focus with a free mind on campus placement drives.
4. Total coaching hours:
 - a. New batch registers in 2021-22, a total of 95 hours of coaching has been offered.
 - b. For the students registered in 2020-21, a total of 100 hours of coaching has been offered.
 - c. For student registered in 2019-20, a total of 100 hours of coaching has been offered.
 - d. For student registered in 2020-21, a total of 100 hours of coaching has been offered.
 - e. For student registered in 2021-22, a total of 100 hours of coaching has been offered.
 - f. For student registered in 2022-23, a total of 250 hours of coaching has been offered.
5. Keeping in view the demands and pattern of the examination, comprehensive coaching was delivered for both preliminary and mains stage of the examination.
6. Various components of general studies like history, art and culture, geography, economy, polity, international relation and internal security, science and technology, environment, CSAT etc are covered.
7. Sir A Sridhar Babu, I.A.S (alumnus of Vignan's Engineering collage) gave his inputs to strengthen the programme and to motivate students.
8. VFSTR has recruited new faculty to expand the in-house coaching team and the entire coaching is offers by the faculty of VCAS. This has proved to be more beneficia to

the students than outsourcing the coaching because of availability of faculty round the clock has increased the performance of students.

9. The library is hosting thousands of books of competitive exams for the benefit of the students, the library timings are scheduled from 8.00am to 11.00pm.

19. How did you prepare for the essay? On what basis did you select the topics of the essay in the exam hall?
Practice is the key to write an essay. It has to be holistic one covering all the dimensions that are required to finish the particular essay. The basis for selecting an essay is how well equipped you are to write that particular topic; can you include the current trends? can you showcase different aspects? are you aware of the past? can you include the diagrams? Is it possible to include reports? etc.
20. How did you prepare for the interview? Does the preparation done during the short period immediately after the mains result actually help in the interview?
Yes, the knowledge gained through the entire preparation does help you in the personality test is just that you have to brush up few concepts beforehand and make sure you are in complete knowledge of the information given in your DAF. Having said this, all your knowledge testing is already done during your prelims and mains stages. So don't be afraid to say that you are not aware of a particular topic. Because in the personality test, it is not your knowledge that is being tested but your presence of mind, your communication skills, your leadership qualities, your body language, your humbleness, your honesty etc.
21. Is it necessary to support/justify/endorse the policies and views of the government while writing the answers of civil services examination or replying in the interview? Can the government's opinion on any issue be opposed?
Since you are going to be a part of the government, although it is recommendable to support on various valid issues, there is nothing like you shouldn't oppose it. After all, we are in a democratic country and our opinions do matter. But when you do, make sure to have relevant points to justify your answer. Because you might be one of those officers who will be framing a future policy of the government!
22. How important do you think it is to have an alternate career back-up while preparing for civil services? Which path had you chosen?
Now again, this is a personal choice. You can always have a Plan-B. I don't think having alternative career options is a bad idea. In fact, it shows how aware you are of the situations around you. However, it is your choice.
23. How did you manage your studies while working?
Although I haven't done this to a larger extent, there are people who still have achieved their goal while working. I think they can guide you better on this or maybe you can watch some of the toppers' videos to make yourself aware of the pros and cons.
24. Lastly, please share some of the questions asked to you during the interview.
It included various issues like...
1. Welfare schemes of the government, 2. Economics based questions since I had Masters in Economics, 3. My hobbies, 4. Noble laureates, 5. Various books etc.
25. Nice to hear from you. We wish you all the best for your future.
Well, thank you for having me speak. I really hope that this would be of some use to at least a few aspirants.

1. Congratulations on your selection! How do you feel?
Thank you sir. I am extremely happy for being selected as group-1 officer with the government of AP.
2. What attracted you to Government Services?
This is one of the services which offers much avenues to serve the nation at various capacities.
3. When did you start your preparation – along with graduation, immediately after it or something else?
I started my preparation after graduation, before that I joined MNC after graduation, worked for couple of years, then I resigned to start my preparation. However, I feel given the intensity demand and competition. Aspirants who start their preparation early (in their graduation) will have an edge over other aspirants.
4. Was this your first attempt? If not, what changes did you make in your strategy for next attempt?
This is my first attempt of group-1 services; I have attempted UPSC-CSE. My strategies for UPSC helped to clear APPSC-Group-1 exam.
5. Were you satisfied with your level of preparation before the exam and were you hopeful of being successful?
I was not satisfied with my preparation for group-1 mains, I only prepared for one week, but after attempting the exam. I was hopeful that I will clear.
6. Considering the extensive syllabus of general studies in preliminary examination and main examination, what strategy did you adopt?
Prelims exam tests the suitability of the candidate by asking objective type question, which requires an extensive knowledge. Mains exam tests the consistency of the candidates through subjective type questions, which requires intensive knowledge/preparation. Therefore, for prelims, candidates should read extensively and for mains, candidates should read intensively (Limited sources More revision).
7. Did you give special emphasis to some particular sections or equal emphasis on all sections? In your opinion, can certain sections be skipped by assuming them to be not so important?
It is always advisable to give equal importance to all the components, but within each component candidates/aspirants may identify certain important areas based on previous year's questions and current affairs...etc.
8. How much time did you take to complete your preparation for all the three stages of the examination? Did you prepare for each stage in sequence or for all the stages simultaneously?
Though the exams are conducted in stages, the preparation cannot be done on sequential order. I therefore would not suggest such strategy. It has to be holistic.

9. How important do you think is making own notes with studies? Please enlighten on the basis of your experience.
It is very important to have own notes, especially for revision. I think, having a personal revision notes for all the topics is a key to success.
10. Did you rely on any electronic material and other social networking sites for your preparation? If yes, did you find them useful? Please share some websites you frequented.
Yes. I rely on YouTube, Instagram, and Telegram. I use Evernote for data management.
11. How did you determine which books, magazines and periodicals to study and which to ignore/leave?
Over a course of time, students will understand what to read and ignore, it is just like learning how to ride a bicycle. Aspirants have to be consistent in their preparation to know what to read and what to know by having the command over the syllabus.
12. In your opinion, how useful is participating in mock test series at different stages of this examination?
Mock tests are useful, we get a chance to assess ourselves, to know our strengths and weakness to adjust the preparation accordingly. This is like net practice as Sachin/Dhoni can't score 100 without net practice.
13. How did you tackle the challenge of time management- whether it was on a daily, monthly or annual basis?
In the initial days of my preparation, I focused more on daily targets. Later on, I have focused on weekly and monthly targets especially after joining a job. I tracked my weekly and monthly progress.
14. How did you maintain consistency in preparation despite the de- motivating and often frustrating nature of the exam?
It's very true that, the journey of the competitive exams is as such that sometimes, we lose the motivation to go ahead. As far as, my preparation is concerned, I have enjoyed the process of learning new things every single day.
15. On an average, how many hours in a day did you devote to studies? What activities did you indulge in when not studying?
I used to take breaks from preparation, spent time with friends and family. Taking up hobbies like cooking, baking, listening to songs, workouts. Having a mental stability is very important and key to success.
16. In your opinion, to what extent is success in main examination dependent on the answer writing style? What approach did you follow in developing the right style of answer writing?
Entire mains exam is subjective basically aspirants have to write answer for each question in about 150-200 or 250-350 words depending on marks and there is an essay paper we have to write 2 essays in 1300 words for each essay.
So developing the writing skills is very important because unlike any other skill it requires constant practice.
17. How did you prepare for the essay? On what basis did you select the topics of the essay in the exam hall?
I didn't prepare exclusively for essay paper. The knowledge acquired for GS paper is

16. What was your optional subject? Did you study it during your graduation or at any level after that? If not, on what basis did you choose it?
Anthropology is my optional. I didn't study it during my graduation or at any level. But I would say that one should consider the following things when choosing an optional. ...
1. Availability of the material
 2. Availability of proper guidance
 3. Extent of the syllabus
 4. Is it scoring or no?
 5. Your interest to study that particular subject.
- Because ultimately you have to write two optional papers which sums up to 500 marks. If you can score good in this, then it is highly possible that you can add up to your score which can further help you to improve your final score.
17. Some people say that some optional subjects are smaller, easier and more scoring than other subjects and hence are more popular. In your opinion, would it be right to say so? While choosing your optional subject did you consider its popularity as a basis?
It is true that some optional like Anthropology are smaller (limited syllabus), easier to prepare (the most time you need to prepare is 3-4 months) and of course more scoring (based on your presentation, you can include a lot of diagrams). Due to these factors, they are popular. But the recent trend analysis proves it partially wrong because we can see many people with different optionals like Sociology, Political Science etc. making the top of the list.
18. In your opinion, to what extent is success in main examination dependent on the answer writing style? What approach did you follow in developing the right style of answer writing?
Now, how do you bring that difference in the answers?
1. Introduction - it can contain the definitions, any report, any quotes by a famous personality, any recent happenings with respect to the topic, an anecdote, an example etc.
2. Body - it varies based on the questioning terms like explain, critically analyze, differentiate, giving your opinion, writing a scenario from any of the epics etc.
But whatever you prefer to write, make sure you sound positively even through the negativity.
And when you are mentioning any heads like the PM, President etc., make sure to add the word HONORABLE i.e. our honorable prime minister shri. so and so etc. These kind of phrases shows your humble nature.
Make sure to maintain continuity between the paras, sometimes you might have to write in the form of points, include diagrams but do not dump them in your paper, try to write a multi-dimensional answer (political aspect, economic aspect, demographic aspect, cultural aspect, historical aspect, scientific aspect, sociological aspect, present scenarios, past scenarios etc). The most important thing is that there has to be that difference in the presentation from question to question. Ensure that the evaluating officer doesn't feel monotonous.
3. Conclusion - it has to conclude in such a way that it complements what you have written in the body i.e. ensure that continuity. And other points can include reports, quotes just like the introduction.

This comes with experience. But being smart gains us what we want. What I am trying to say is that, taking experiences from the people who have already been in this for a while helps us know about what to read and what not to.
Though reading the stuff and gaining knowledge for yourself is a wonderful thing to do, I believe that sometimes smart work outplays the hard work.
12. In your opinion, how useful is participating in mock test series at different stages of this examination?
All of us are definitely aware of the fact that PRACTICE MAKES MAN PERFECT. The more the number of mock tests you attempt, that more you will get used to writing on the examination DAY.
So what I would say is that BE CONFIDENT. LEARN FROM THE MISTAKES. DON'T LET YOUR PREVIOUS PERFORMANCES HAVE AN IMPACT ON THE CURRENT ONES.

13. How did you tackle the challenge of time management- whether it was on a daily, monthly or annual basis?
Again, this varies from person to person. But I think practicing mock questions and previous year questions of the General Studies and Optional on daily basis and the General Essay on weekly basis will help you better with your time management.
14. How did you maintain consistency in preparation despite the de-motivating and often, frustrating nature of the exam?
I wouldn't say that it was de-motivating. I would rather say that it was definitely challenging because when this is what you have always wanted, you would go to any extent to have it. So my idea of aching it had kept me going.

15. On an average, how many hours in a day did you devote to studies? What activities did you indulge in when not studying?
If I had to answer this question, I know that it would be very surprising for you to know that I haven't studied beyond 4-5 hours a day! This is because I know that I couldn't spend much time on constantly doing the same stuff. So I have learnt about myself first and planned my preparation accordingly.
When I was pursuing my Masters I used to also study the same and play a lot of Badminton.
And after my Masters, I stayed back at home and prepared. Then I started reading books (a special hobby of mine since the pandemic, because till then, I thought that only people who have come from different planets would have a hobby of reading books. But trust me, this is very addictive), writing few stuff, and apart from these, I also used to watch IPL, PKL, Korean Dramas.

more than enough to have content. But one should know how to present the content for essays. And writing style for GS/ essays is little difficult. Students can refer to 'we the people' by Nani Pahlhi Wala. They can imitate the style of writing.

18. How did you prepare for the interview? Does the preparation done during the short period immediately after the mains result actually help in the interview?
Yes, it helps attending mock interviews, practicing questions and reading newspapers.
19. Is it necessary to support/justify/endorse the policies and views of the government while writing the answers of civil services examination or replying in the interview? Can the government's opinion on any issue be opposed?
You have to understand that if we are appearing for true exam it means we are trying to be a part of government and when you want to be a part of any organization you can't be very critical and cynical about the organization but exam itself will give the scope for construction of criticism. Questions are framed in such a way that candidate will have scope to make constructive criticism or suggestions to improve policies etc.

20. How important do you think it is to have an alternate career back-up while preparing for civil services? Which path had you chosen?
UPSC means union public service commission but on a lighter note aspirant also call it unpredictable public service commission so the success in the exam is little unpredictable. It is always advisable to have a backup plan. Remember do not put all your eggs in one tray. Aspirants must be dynamic to make decisions.
21. How did you manage studies while working?
As I said earlier after joining a job I started tracking my weekly progress, monthly progress. I used to utilize holidays, weekends and I took a long leave before exam. In fact, I should thank Vignan for giving me this space/scope for preparation Sharada mam and my colleagues, who have extended constant support in this regard.

1. Congratulations on your selection! How do you feel?
It feels so surreal and I give this as a tribute to all those who have put their faith in my capabilities I am grateful to my family who has been very supportive through this entire journey. And last but not the least...I only see this as another step towards achieving my actual goal of becoming an IAS officer.
2. What attracted you to Government Services?
The thought and the fact that I could be available to provide my services in full capacity to the public at all times was my motivating factor to opt for government services. And this thought has been inculcated and sowed in me by my parents and I thank them for guiding me in the absolute right way.
3. When did you start your preparation – along with graduation, immediately after it or something else?
I knew that I would be taking up these competitive exams right from my UG. But then due to my profound interest for Economics, I went on to pursue Masters in Economics. That was exactly when I have started my preparation simultaneously.
4. Was this your first attempt? If not, what changes did you make in your strategy for this attempt?
Although I have achieved this in my first attempt, I still would like to make few changes to my strategy. One of those changes would include multiple revisions and being generous with respect to the number of mock tests attempted. Rest, I would like to keep it the same.
5. Were you satisfied with your level of preparation before the exam and were your hopeful of being successful?
Well, when asked about such question, I don't think anybody would be satisfied with the amount of preparation made before the exam. Having said that, I would like to mention a few points to justify my answer. Firstly, the Syllabus...Despite the fact that the syllabus is mentioned in the notification, we still need to discover proper bounds and limits to that syllabus, which can only be understood on referring to the previous years' question papers and sometimes finding these papers could be difficult. Secondly, the fact that the questions are not fact based anymore i.e. They are conceptual and that you could be asked about anything under the sun, which requires us to be thorough with all the current happenings across the world. Most importantly, the time management, to which you can get used to, only on practicing mock tests.
But then, for some reason, I was hopeful of making it to the final list.
6. Considering the extensive syllabus of general studies in preliminary examination and main examination, what strategy did you adopt?
There is nothing called strategy as such.., but, it is very important that you keep yourselves equipped with the thorough understanding of the syllabus. It is very important that you prepare keeping the mains examination on your mind. Because, it is this, which helps

you gain analytical skills that is much needed to crack this examination.

So be it, the preliminary or the mains examination, make sure to have that knowledge about the current issues. And when I say current issues, it could even date back to the prior 2 or 3 years!

And above all, it's not about how many books that you have studied, but it is all about how many times you have studied the same book. Because the latter, helps you retain the information much better.

Did you give special emphasis to some particular sections or equal emphasis on all sections? In your opinion, can certain sections be skipped by assuming them to be not so important?

Speaking of this particular question, it is true that not all the topics are important. But it is very important to note that no topic mentioned in the syllabus is unimportant! It is only less important compared to some other major topics. This means that you should try to gain a medium level of knowledge about the less important topics also, because these exams are very unpredictable and you don't want to keep yourself at a typical place in the examination hall.

How much time did you take to complete your preparation for all the three stages of the examination? Did you prepare for each stage in sequence or for all the stages simultaneously?

The time varies from person to person as the capacities to intake the information varies. I think it took me around 1 to 1.5 years to complete my preparation. As I have already mentioned, I have done my Masters and the preparation simultaneously. However, I think that is an ideal amount of time required for a complete preparation because you don't want to force the subjects into your brain, which can be counterproductive. So taking your own amount of time based on your level of understanding is vital to ace this type of examinations.

Well, I have prepared for the Mains examination first which also helped me crack the Preliminary examination. And for the Personality Test, in addition to the knowledge gained from mains preparation, I have learnt more about the information that I have given in my DAF.

How important do you think is making own notes with studies? Please enlighten on the basis of your experience.

I personally, didn't make much notes along with initial preparation because I have had the alternatives like highlighting the important points, writing pieces of information on sticky notes, adding the points in the given book itself etc. But towards the end of your preparation, you definitely need to have certain hand written notes (this doesn't mean that you have to author another copy of the same book). You just need to write it in the form of codes or pictorial representations based on your understanding of the concepts. This will help you in revising the concepts multiple times within a limited time span.

Did you rely on any electronic material and other social networking sites for your preparation? If yes, did you find them useful? Please share some websites you frequented.

The electronic material or e-learning can be both a boon and bane for your preparation. Let me mention the sources that I have relied on...

1. Vision IAS for current affairs materials like PT365, MAINS365 (they will give immense knowledge about a particular topic)
