	Welcoming the members of Academic Council by the Chair.		
	The meeting commenced with the remarks by the Chair, Col. Prof. P. Nagabhus welcoming the members to the 43 rd Academic Council meeting. He handed over meeting to be commenced by the Member Secretary, Prof. Vijaya Ramu. The Chair narrated the backdrop of instatement of the new Chancellor Dr. Pave Subba Rao, the former ISRO technocrat and Chairman of Ananth Technolog Hyderabad on 6 th November 2025.		
	Dean AAA then rendered the profile of Dr. Subba Rao. The Chair mentioned the first and the second Chancellors Dr. B. Rama Moorthi Naidu and Dr. L. Ratthaiah. And the third incumbent Dr. Subba Rao was proposed by the Hon'ble Chairman of Vignam Group, and the same was graciously accepted by the latter. The proposal for the incumbency of Dr. Subba Rao as the third Chancellor of VFSTR was unanimously accepted by the members of 9th Executive Council. The 43rd Academic Council welcomed the new Chancellor in absentia, and the Member Secretary read the profile of the new Chancellor of VFSTR stating that Dr. P. Subba Rao was an ardent follower of Swami Vivekananda. With the spirit to stimulate the development of indigenous technology, he established Ananth Technologies Limited, three decades ago. Dr. Subba Rao, who advocated the public and private partnership in development of space technology, through his organisation had been the contributor of many major space programs. He, in his career, received several awards and accolades.		
	The Chair stated that Dr. Subba Rao's appointment was the realization of industry – academy synchrony and the directed the Member Secretary to convey this introduction to the Chancellor.

4. Enhance supervision and monitoring of progress

The HoD stated that all the above-said strategies were approved by the BoS. Additionally, experts like Dr. Javed Ali, School of Pharmacy, Jamia Hamdard, New Delhi and Dr. Mohana Lakshmi, Amity University, Gwalior, M.P. Both the experts were consulted as Jamia Hamdard, N.D. has good diversity of students, while Amity University has sizable number of students from Bihar. The student committee was also included in the process of evolving the action plan.

Responding to this action plan, the Chair appreciated the increase of weightage of Continuous Internal Assessment from 3 marks out of 25 (12%) to 15 marks out of 25 (60%).

Dr. Shanthi Swarup appreciated the plan which had focussed on enhancing language capabilities of students. He stated that some early warning systems concerning attendance and drop out should also be maintained. He also mentioned the concerns about the pass percentage of the target group and advised for a regular monitoring of the system.

The HoD stated that he discussed the diagnostic test in the 42nd ACM and the performance of the students in the test owes to their earlier academic background. He said that there were no problems related to the social adjustment of the students from Bihar. The Chair opined that proper socialization of the students with their local counterparts would help them in academics.

Prof. P. Sreenivas Kumar enquired about the hostel arrangement of the Bihar students and advocated that they should be encouraged to inter mingle with the local students.

Dean SA responded that the students of Bihar and others had common hostel. She stated that those students mingle with all the rest in all activities.

Dr. Subba Reddy enquired on the design of any instrument to measure the students' academic progression and emotional well-being. The Dean SA responded that 8 Counselling Psychologists were deployed to address the relevant problems of the students and the Chair concluded stating that the university aims to achieve the counsellor – student ratio at 1:500.

The Chief Executive Officer, VFSTR further clarified by stating the following:

- A. Faculty student ratio was maintained at 1:20 for counselling by faculty.
- B. Qualified psychologists are deployed to redress any relevant problems and a personalised app which gives an easy and effective access to redress is in the pipe line.
- C. All the efforts of psychologists are being documented.
- D. A yearly health check-up for all the students of VFSTR is conducted to identify malnutrition etc, related problems.
- E. The Department of MBA is conducting a project to map the consumption of junk food in the campus.

The agenda point was presented by Dean R&D as the part of agenda points for information.

III. Agenda Items for Discussion and Approval

1. List of identified online courses from platforms such as SWAYAM, NPTEL and MOOCs aligned with the recommendations of the 6th Deans' committee of ICAR and the principles of NEP 2020 for inclusion in the B.Sc. (Hons) Agriculture curriculum for 10 credits – presented by Dean SAFT

The Dean presented the point under the following heads:

Dr. Shanthi Swarup appreciated the plan as flexible, valuable, and multi-disciplinary that encourages student choice and initiative. He requested the Dean to identify some areas of concern:

- a. Since courses are non-gradial, the students may resort to selecting some easy choices.
- b. There should be assessment of integration.
- c. The plan is good for scoring co-curricular achievements.
- d. Student mentors should be helpful to guide the students in labs.
- e. Develop a pathway to realize the plan.
- f. Publications should be gradial.

The Dean answered that there would be a presentation after the completion of the course at the department level. Mentorship shall be provided with staff of whom 70% are doctorates. Dr. Swarup advised that other departments also should emulate this model.

Prof. Sreenivas Kumar stated that the plan encourages group work and individual work but there should be a clear discrimination between individual contribution and contribution within the team.

The Chair opined that all credits in the plan were given to courses and they also be given to classes.

The agenda item was approved by the members after deliberation.

Prof. Sreenivas Kumar appreciated the efforts of the Dean R&D and advised that the University should maintain a contingency fund to cope with the delay of fund release by government. He also advised that faculty presenting in the international conferences should be initially encouraged by funding them so that they gain knowledge and develop networking. The Chair opined that such funding should be provided to the faculty during vacation. He also advised to host an annual research scholars Event. The Dean responded to Prof. Sreenivas Kumar's enquiry on availability of space in affirmative.

Dr. Shanti Swarup appreciated the Dean's presentation and stated that the Dean should also work on the broad based approach, definition of a CoE, and roadmap for CoEs. He also opined that there should be an audit of research funding that tallies with the research output. Dr. Swarup stated that there should be a screening committee for patents and publications should be increased along with multidisciplinary approach of research.

Dr. Subba Reddy appreciated the Research (Hons.) program and advised to encourage the students to present posters and paper presentations. He opined that a method to be evolved to continue the problem to students of B.Tech. (Research) to the successive batches.

The Vice-Chairman enquired on the consultancy possibilities in the departments of Civil Engg. and English. Prof. A. Sharada responded that the Cambridge Centre at VFSTR is organizing training sessions for the faculty and teachers of colleges and schools. The Vice-Chairman advised that such programs should be documented and properly projected.
