Minutes of the 8th Meeting of the Executive Council

	Welcoming the members of Academic Council by the Chair.
	The meeting commenced with the welcome remarks by the Chair, Col. Prof. P Nagabhushan who greeted and welcomed the members to the 8 th Executive Counci meeting which is exclusively dedicated to the three convocations scheduled at VFSTR He expressed his pleasure of sharing the platform with the External Members who were physically present in the meeting.
	The Chair handed over the meeting to the Member Secretary who also welcomed all the members of the 8 th Executive Council. He stated that the XIII Convocation of VFSTI shall be held on 2 nd August, 2025 and it would be followed by the convocations of CDOE (III convocation) and Polytechnic Education (I convocation) which would be held together on 3 rd August, 2025. The Member Secretary mentioned that over 2006 candidates would be receiving their degrees in these convocations.
Ι	Agenda Items for Discussion and Approval
	The Chancellor Dr. Lavu Rattaiah welcomed all the guests to the meeting. He stated that Faculty Immersion Program was highly successful with the first batch of 40 facult beneficiaries who returned after their attachment to industry. This FIP has resulted in attainment of projects for faculty as well as the acceptance of Ananth Technologies to sanction a Centre of Excellence in the area of space research at VFSTR. That would be followed by the Centres of Excellence that were promised by ten other companies in the coming year.
	The Chancellor stated that there would be industry specific placements in the comin years.
	The Chancellor stated that well before the Hon'ble Supreme Court mandated to appoint Psychologists in every educational institution, the same was fulfilled by VFSTI appointing the experts at the ratio of one psychologist for every hundred students. The Chancellor stated that the placements, in spite of the current meltdown, were 75% which was possible with the enablement of students in self-learning. The Chancellor stated that AI based orientation was desirable for which Dr. Ghant Subba Rao and others will be supportive. The admissions were good and only 12% yet to be completed. He stated that the courses on Design Technology and AI base learning would be in place soon. The University would function on shift system basis this year. He thanked all the members for extending their cooperation all through.
	1. Chief Guest and Guest of Honour for the XIII Convocation – Presented by D. M. Ramesh Naidu, Chief Co-ordinator of the XIII Convocation.
	The Chief Coordinator informed that the XIII Convocation of VFSTR would be grace by His Excellency, The Governor of Andhra Pradesh, Shri Abdul Nazeer as the Chief Guest. The Chair lauded the efforts of the Chief Guest as a distinguished jurist. The Coordinator then presented the profile of the Chief Guest. He then presented the profiles of the Guests of Honour Shri Srinivasa Raju, Founder of iLabs Group Hyderabad; Mr. Ashok Attaluri, MD Zen Technologies, Hyderabad and Komandur Ramachary, a musical luminary and mentor. The Chief Coordinator then moved the motion to confer <i>Honoris Causa</i> (Doctor of Science and Doctor of Letters) to the visiting celebrities. The motion was approved by all the members of the 8th Executive Council. 2. Details of Students Receiving Degrees During the XIII Convocation – Presente
	by Dean AAA and FA

The Dean AAA & FA stated that 2137 candidates from multiple streams like Engineering, Sciences, Management and Humanities would be receiving their degrees in this convocation. This multiplicity of courses makes it evident that VFSTR is proving itself to be a MERU. The Dean AAA & FA presented the agenda point under the following heads:

After the presentation by the Dean, Prof. B.V.R. Chowdary enquired if the number of awardees was progressing for which the Dean answered in affirmative.

Prof. Lalit M Patnaik enquired on the incidence of multiple entry and multiple exit in this instance, then the Dean responded that one student of B.Tech. Food Technology has opted this facility and moved to B.Sc. Food Technology.

In the discussion about the medium of instruction in the lecturing activity, the Chair asserted that L based classes will be purely taught in English medium to suit to the needs of non-local students while the T and P sessions, for the convenience of some students, the interaction will be in vernacular language.

He also apprised the members that the Chancellor's Birthday, on 28th July, would be celebrated henceforth as the Foundation day.

The Chair also mentioned that of the students receiving their degrees, only 6% had limited themselves to 160 credits while 93% had acquired additional academic credentials through were efforts. Three percent of students were inclined towards research.

DR. E.S. Chakravarthi asked about the external add on courses for which the Chair responded that the students receive the add on certification from companies like CISCO etc., He mentioned that R22 facilitated multiple entry, multiple pause, multiple exit and multiple re-entry. He also mentioned about the Student Exchange Program and also the growing startup-culture at VFSTR and the support offered by the University for the same.

The Dean AAA informed that till date, VFSTR awarded 19508 degrees since its inception. He mentioned that the pass percentage has trended from 95 to 91 and mentioned that in the coming two or three months the percentage would improve.

3. Chief Guests and Guests of Honour for the III Convocation of CDOE and I Convocation of Polytechnic Education – Presented by Dr. M. Ramesh Naidu, Chief Co-ordinator of the III Convocation

The Chief Co-ordinator for the III Convocation of CDOE presented the profiles of Prof. K. Ram Kumar, Former Director of IIM Raipur and Smt. Galla Radha Rani, Founder of RR Sports, Vijayawada as the Chief Guest and Guest of Honour respectively for the III Convocation of the CDOE.

After the presentation, Dr. E.S. Chakaravarthi stated that in the next presentation the emphasis should be on insights rather than information by the presentation being graphical.

The Chancellor questioned on the average pass percentage which was only 70% the Director stated that due to default of attendance below 70% some candidates were not promoted. The Chancellor advised the Director to identify the issues while still retaining the standards. The Chair hinted at the possibility of conducting live classes.

Dr. E.S. Chakravarthi enquired on the placement of Polytechnic students for which the Director mentioned that most of them opt for joining B.Tech. The Chancellor opined that the Polytechnic students should join companies like HCL which were employing Intermediate students, work for certain time and then return to pursue B.Tech.

The Chancellor enquired on the delivery of AI content to the Polytechnic students and the Director answered in affirmative.
