The Chairperson, of BoS Dr. Sharada Allamneni, Professor and Head, Department of English initiated the meeting by greeting the external subject experts, Prof. Amith Kumar (Dept. of Comparative Literature and Indian Studies) and Prof. Veda Sharan (Dept. of English as Second Language Studies) and then introducing them to the internal members. The Chairperson briefed the panel on how the M.A. English programme with its multipronged approach and *learning centric* (continuous learning and continuous assessment) model is compliant with the broad principles of NEP 2020. The MA curriculum under *R-22* provided for multiple entry and multiple exits.

The following points were discussed in the BoS meeting:

- 1. Regulation R22.
- 2. Curriculum Structure with Credits, Credit distribution.
- 3. 2 Modular Structure with 4 Units instead of 5 Units in each paper.
- 4. Assessment Methods (Formative & Summative).
- 5. Grading Schemes.
- 6. Electives and Add-on courses

The following resolutions were arrived at after the discussion:

- 1. BoS Members appreciated the revised regulations, curriculum structure, and the syllabus of M.A. English programmes with the minor modifications proposed, as it was in keeping with the broad spirit of NEP 2020. Curriculum structure is indicated under Appendix-I.
- 2. Major restructuring has been carried out in the curriculum from R-20 to R-22 for enabling Continuous Learning Assessment based on the two modular structure.
- 3. Another major reformation that has taken place in the curriculum is the incorporation of Add-on courses for 12 more credits in addition to the existing credits of the course. Some of these Add-on courses can be availed on the Swayam or the NPTEL platform.

- 4. The curriculum also encompasses the UGC recommended mandatory courses for promoting employability or skill development of the students (details for which are provided in Appendix-II).
- 5. Significant changes have been made in the content of all courses for them to merit being considered as new courses, the details for which are indicated in Appendix- III.
- 6. About 20% of syllabus was revised to modify the previous curriculum.

7. Some of the suggestions offered by the subject experts were:

- a) Like the paper on History of English Language there should also be a paper covering the History of English Literature to trace the broad trends and movements in the sociocultural developments in England to understand the chronological developments in English literature.
- b) The paper on History of English Language should also include the topics: *The Great Vowel Shift, Contribution of renaissance to vocabulary and grammar, English as the lingua franca, The current domination of American English in the world.*
- c) Students should study some ancient European texts to appreciate the flavor of English literature
- d) The course title Modern Literature Survey could be renamed as Modernist Literatures A Survey and the paper should include alternative modernities like in India through the inclusion of writers like Arun Kolatkar and Jayanta Mahapatra.
- e) The course on Cultural Studies may be made more specific by focusing on Film Studies or Gender Studies, since Cultural Studies as a discipline has evolved and branched off into separate discipline slike Film Studies, Gender Studies etc.
- f) The experts also stressed that Courses like 'Writing for Journalism,' 'Introduction to Creative Writing' and 'Translation Studies' should be taught by practicing professionals from the field and not the regular teachers from the department.

Based on the suggestions given by the members, the Chairperson of BoS summarized that the discussions had been fruitful and the suggestions offered by the invited experts Prof. Amith Kumar and Prof. Veda Sharan would be incorporated appropriately in the MA curriculum and syllabus of the regulation R22 before presenting it for final approval to the BoS and subsequently to the Academic Council of VFSTR.

The Chairperson thanked the external subject experts as well as the internal members before concluding the meeting.
