

Young minds sparkle at Tedx

Inspiring talks from a group of achievers and noted personalities across the country, thought-provoking ideas and a platform that saw many young minds come together were the highlights of the second edition of TEDx conducted at VFSTR on Saturday. The event was held under the motto 'Fly'. The series of discussions, involving the young and fresh minds on one side and the ripe and experienced on the other, made the programme as lively and informative as possible.

Each of the speakers at the event had initiated and brought about a change in their profession, sharing their perceptions of the changing paradigms of the world in a series of motivating speeches that left the young crowd captivated.

Addressing the audience, Jasti Chelameswar, former judge of the Supreme Court of India who was one the speakers, shares his views on dynamics of the present generation which is on a fast-track mode towards success.

“The youth today have withdrawn from the current governance because they are disillusioned by the ways of the leaders and the corruption that exists at every level. Raising voice against the problems in the society itself is being in Politics and need not contest in elections” he added. P Sasi Kumar, Founder of Siksha who train youngsters to face the multi-dimensional challenges they face in modern world told to work among disadvantaged boys and girls and counsels them on careers and opportunities available to them, exam stress and other such issues that they are not aware of.
