C. Sharada Prabhakar addressing the students on the occasion said that the answer is not for men and women to try to be alike. All men and women must be themselves, realizing that God has given each of us unique abilities with which to pursue our goals, and that our primary responsibility is to take full advantage of those abilities.

Speaking on the occasion, Registrar, Cmde. Dr. M.S Rangunathan lauded the Women Empowerment and Development Cell of VFSTR which celebrates every function in a smooth and grand way.

“Let's celebrate the incredible strength of women to strengthen the foundation of the society,” he concluded.

Dr. A. Krishna Kumari who was one of the guests of honour highlighted the Section – 497, Adultery law of Adultery Indian Penal Code among the gathering. She said that man and woman represent two forms of divine energy; they are the male and female elements of a single soul.

She also said that for a human being to lead a total life, he or she must have both forms of energy: the power of strength and the power of subtlety; the power of giving and the power of receiving. Ideally, these energies are merged seamlessly.

She also informed the girl students to be cautious in the society. She also said that girls should be mature enough to tackle the situations. Being a mature person is behaving as a responsible and dignified person, she added.

It was the labor moment of the twentieth century in North America that came out to be the time when this day emerged.
