
The Earth's Hottest Year Ever

2024 has become the hottest year on record, reflecting the deepening effects of climate change. This Unprecedentved rise in global temperatures is primarily driven by human activities such as burning fossil fuels, deforestation, and industrialization. The heatwaves breaking records across the globe highlight the urgency of addressing climate change.

The 2024 heat has been exacerbated by the return of the El Nino phenomenon, which amplifies the effects of global warming. This interaction between natural climate events and humandriven warming have caused more frequent and intense weather events, deepened the climate crisis and highlighted the vulnerability of global ecosystems.


- 16 of the last 17 months have experienced high average temperatures
- November alone was the second-hottest November on record, with temperatures around 1.62°C above preindustrial levels.
- Global temperatures have now exceeded the critical 1.5°C threshold

Greenhouse gases like CO2 and methane trap heat in the



atmosphere, causes global warming. These rising temperatures contribute to severe heatwaves, which pose significant health risks, particularly for people such as the elderly, children, and outdoor workers, leading to increased instances of heat-related illnesses and deaths.

Agriculture, water supplies, and energy systems are also heavily impacted by the ongoing heat. Crop yields are decreasing, water resources are dwindling, and many regions are facing severe droughts. This disproportionately affects developing nations where agriculture plays a key role in the economy, further exacerbating food insecurity and poverty.


Celebrating the Spirit of Indian Constitution

The Kite Runner

Khaled Hosseini's Debut book The Kite Runner is an elegant tale of friendship, betrayal, and redemption set against the backdrop of a tumultuous Afghanistan. The story revolves around Amir, the privileged son of a wealthy Kabul merchant, and Hassan, the son of his father's servant. Societal divisions, personal failures, and the violent upheavals of Afghan history test their bond throughout the story while capturing their turbulent childhood experiences along with the changes a person can undergo while visiting their past once again.

What stands out in this novel is Hosseini's powerful storytelling. His writing accurately captures the emotional depth of human experiences, let alone a child's, making the reader empathise with Amir's guilt and Hassan's unwavering loyalty. The vivid imagery of Kabul before the Russian Soviet invasion is both nostalgic and heartbreaking for me, creating a sharp contrast with the city's later descent into war and ruin. I particularly appreciated how Hosseini explored deeper emotional themes like the weight of guilt, the search for redemption, the consequences of having privilege and how certain power dynamics impact the other. Each page of the book is filled with raw emotions, drawing me into Amir's conflicted world.

The plot follows Amir's journey from childhood to adulthood, marked by a life-defining betrayal in the story. After a painful incident involving Hassan, Amir's

silence fractures their friendship and changes their lives forever. Years later, Amir, now living in America, returns to Taliban-ruled Afghanistan to confront his past and seek redemption. This journey is filled with danger but offers a chance for Amir to find peace and honour Hassan's memory.

Hosseini's first-person narration gave a more detailed look into Amir's thoughts and feelings. His honesty about Amir's flaws makes him a relatable and human protagonist. The narrative is laced with cultural nuances, offering insight into Afghan traditions and the impact of historical events on individuals' lives. However, some readers might find Amir's early selfishness frustrating, though it underscores his eventual growth and transformation.

Overall, The Kite Runner is a deeply moving novel that masterfully intertwines personal stories with historical events. It is a tale of heartbreak and hope, reminding us of the enduring power of love and forgiveness and how it can transform a person, throughout their life. While some moments are emotionally heavy, they add to the book's authenticity and impact.
